


# Welcome to ECG Summit Highlights of 2020

## **NEW PROJECTS**

"Technical Assistance for Revitalisation of the Tourism Sector in Adiyaman" - EuropeAid/139608/ IH/SER/TR

ECG Summit was part of Consortium, led by Serenas Turizm Kongre ve Organizasyon Hizmetleri Ltd. Sti. (Serenas Tourism & Organisation), which was awarded the EU funded project in Turkey "Technical Assistance for Revitalisation of the Tourism Sector in Adiyaman", EuropeAid/139608/ IH/SER/TR.



The main objective of this contract is to improve competitiveness of the tourism sector in Adiyaman. In the scope of this purpose technical assistance will be provided for escalating the number and visibility of marketable tourism assets and facilitating the establishment and/or improvement of local capacities, especially those of the SMEs, to contribute to and benefit from the new tourism development trajectory of the province.

We are also pleased to announce that ECG was part of Consortium led by REPRESENT COMMUNICATIONS which was awarded to write Communication Strategy and Action Plan for CEFTA. The overall objective of the project is to raise awareness on CEFTA activities in member countries, demystify its role and bring it closer in competitiveness of the organization by supporting regional cooperation and creating more favorable economic environment.

In order to increase visibility and impact of the CEFTA's achievements, the Communication Strategy and Action Plan will enable more effective communication with key stakeholder groups by developing and providing support in implementing CEFTA Communication Strategy, a tool for streamlining and seeking synergy in the efforts invested by the CEFTA Parties, CEFTA Secretariat and their partner organisations.

Improving Capacities of the Prison Administration in the Area of Alternative Sanctions, Post Penal Care and Healthcare

Consortium led by ECG is continuing its successful work on the EU funded project "Improving capacities of the prison administration in the area of alternative sanctions,

**post penal care and penal healthcare"** in Serbia. Despite the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, the project continued with many activities, some of which we are highlighting below.

On February 4<sup>th</sup>, the project team organized the workshop at the IN HOTEL in Belgrade, which gathered representatives of institutions and organizations working in the field of penal and post penal treatment with two main goals:



Workshop with Commissioners, representatives of prison institutions' treatment staff and representatives of the project.

- 1) to provide information relevant to the project activities for treatment staff and commissioners
- 2) to inform treatment staff and commissioners on the purpose of the project and its activities.

During this workshop, the project's Team Leader, Chris Frost, presented the mandate and purpose of the project, as well as activities the project team will undertake in order to achieve set results. The Workshop was concluded with session where the feedback from group discussions held during the workshop were presented to attendees.

## **ToT (Training for trainers)**

During July and August 2020, a training for basic trainer skills was organized for workers in field of penal and post penal treatment. The three-day training course was attended by 21 trainees divided in three groups. In order to implement this activity respecting health and safety measures during the current COVID 19 pandemic, the project team developed a methodology for online training for all three groups and courses were carried out successfully via Google Meet platform.







Training for trainers, as a part of project activities, is designed to give a foundation for further implementation of activities aiming to train and prepare staff working in the area of penal and post-penal care in terms of new programmes of the Administration for Execution of Penal Sanctions.

Legal Aid, Assistance and Dissemination of Information Necessary for Ensuring the Protection and Exercising Right of IDPS, Refugees and Returnees

Consortium led by ECG is continuing its successful work on the EU funded project "Legal aid, assistance and dissemination of information necessary for ensuring the protection and exercising right of IDPs, refugees and returnees" in Serbia. Despite coronavirus pandemic, the project continued with many of the planned activities, including panel discussions, trainings, open door events some of which are highlighted below.

## **Panel discussions**

The project organized the first panel discussion, "Right of returnees to right" on the 5<sup>th</sup> of March 2020 in Belgrade. Within this panel discussion, the project's expert Mr. Stevan Nikolic presented current mechanisms of returnees' acceptance, as well as recommendations for improving those mechanisms to make re-inclusion of this group easier. The event was opened by Dr. Zoran Bojović, Assistant Director of the

Office for Kosovo and Metohija, and besides Mr. Stevan Nikolic, representatives of the Commissariat for Refugees and Migration (CSR) and the project their perspective on this topic.

The panel discussion "Economic empowerment of returnees to Serbia" was organized on June 24th, 2020. On this occasion, the project's expert Ales Zupan presented the thematic report with the same title, followed by representatives of CSR, Roma League and the project.

## **Trainings**

The free legal aid project continued training young project experts in field of providing legal assistance to its targeted groups. During this period, the project organized two training courses focused on assisting returnees upon readmission agreements in obtaining their legal documents, as well as the work and organization of relevant institutions in KiM: 1) Training course, organized on the 20th and 21st of May in Vrnjacka Banja, focused on the definition and meaning of citizenship, birth registry and personal documents and collaboration of the project with state institutions on providing needed assistance to returnees; and 2) Training course organized on the 11th and 12th of June 2020 in Vrnjacka Banja covered the organization of work of the Special Chamber of the Supreme Court in Pristina in charge of matters of social enterprises' privatization. Apart from the theoretical part, trainees had an exercise of determining legal actions in concrete cases.

## **Open door events**

The Free legal aid project in collaboration with the Municipality of Beocin and a local trustee for refugees and migration organized on 27 February 2020 an Open door event for internally displaced people, refugees and returnees upon readmission agreements residing in this municipality.



The event was organized with purpose to inform all the interesed parties on legal assistance the project provides for these targeted groups to help them resolve legal issues caused by their migartion status. Apart from this informational part of the event, all gathered had the opportunity to present to the legal team their legal issues at individual meetings. This event was attended by more than 40 interested residents of Beocin with IDP, refugee or returnee status.



## **ECG SUMMIT PROJECT UPDATE**

## Support to Implementing Anti-Corruption Strategies in Bosnia and Herzegovina

Consortium led by ECG successfully continued implementation of the EU funded project "Support to implementing anti-corruption strategies in Bosnia and Herzegovina" which provides assistance to anticorruption bodies and institutions at all levels of government in BiH to raise the fight against corruption in the country at a higher and more engaged level.

In January 2020, IPAK project concluded 7-month long support to BiH Anti-corruption Agency (APIK) on drafting new anti-corruption strategy and action plan for its implementation. Strategy and action plan could have significant impact on the sectorial approach in the prevention and fight against corruption, improve detection and repression of corruption and improve cooperation and coordination of work of anti-corruption bodies (ACB) at all levels in BiH. IPAK also continued support for raising competencies, position and capacities (so called professionalization) of ACBs at all levels.

Part of these efforts to support ACBs was round-table organized in Gorazde, with local Anti-Corruption Team in Bosnian - Podrinje Canton. This was the final event in activity which included: assessment of status of anticorruption network and citizens reporting system in the institutions at all levels; recommendations for establishment, competencies and work of AC network in the institutions. It was also the last event with physical participation before moving to online conferences due to covid-19.

Due to covid-19 situations project's Steering Committee's meetings in May and September were successfully organized as online events. Deterioration of the covid-19 situation in the region in autumn 2020 resulted in decision to keep with this format for both SCM and events, such as presentation of the analysis and conference on BiH anti-corruption legislation, planned for November.
